


This week we would like you to read the story 'Tiddler' by Julia Donaldson. You might have this already at home. It looks like this:

This week we are going to be thinking about time.

Activity 1: Hula Hoop Clock




Before you start:

- Collect the resources shown in the picture above: Chalk, sticks, Hula hoop (optional)
- Design your clock

Once you have made your clock see if you can make the different times stated in the story. Focus on o'clock and understanding where the big and little hands go and what this means.

Challenge: Can you show/understand half past?

Activity 2: a.m. to p.m. / morning to evening



Before you start:

- Print the attached resources that has been made or make one yourself if printer is not available (Choose between sheets dependent on ability)
- Gather together some crayons/pencils
- Make a list of key events in your day

Once you have gathered all the resources, think about the key events and whether they take place in the morning or evening / A.M or P.M. Colour in the correct answer using different colours

Challenge: Can you sequence the daily events in the right order from the start of the day to the end of the day?

Activity 3: Can you make your own watch?



Before you start:


- Gather together the resources you need/want to make your watch. You will definitely need card, pens, scissors, a split pin and glue

Activity 4: Sensory Clock




Before you start:
