Leicester Wheels For All came in to let the children experience different types of bicycles. This was another fun opportunity to interact with different people and to try something new.

We have introduced switches and symbols to the lunchtime routine so that pupils can now choose the meal they would like.

Children are fully engaged in our daily Reading and Phonics sessions. Teachers are being very creative in the way these are delivered to ensure that all pupils are motivated and making progress.





We have held 3 Parent Workshops this term on Sensory Lifestyles, Toileting and Supporting Behaviour in the Home. We have also run a 10-week National Autistic Society Early Bird Plus programme for families. Information about future Parent Workshops will be coming out shortly.

I look forward to continuing to work with you all during the Summer Term where we have more exciting things planned.























Post-16 - A Message from Sally, Head of Centre

This term seems to have passed really quickly but once again we've been busy with that time. One of our focuses continues to be providing our students with considerable experience in the community and we've achieved that by running 68 sessions between January and the end of March. Those trips have included students shopping in Asda and borrowing books from the BRITE centre however it also includes visiting an exhibition at the Newarke and campaigning for Fair Trade at Asda in Fosse Park.





Asda need a big thank you as their Community Champion, Debbie Kenney has provided numerous opportunities for students to develop their learning outside of the classroom. They have also donated books and run sessions for World book day and they have donated cake mixes for our Enterprise activities. Further to this they have provided a number of female hygiene products for us to use in a new Female Health intervention.

Preparing students for Employment in the future remains a key focus and we are very appreciative of the support from the DWP and We Discover organisations who've helped us co-ordinate trial interview sessions with our students.

We've extended our work experience placements by setting up a 'Time to Talk' café on Monday afternoon that is open to the public (You are all welcome from 1.45 -2.45 pm on selected Mondays during term time). This allows students to develop skills in preparing and serving hot drinks to people from







outside Post 16 which is an excellent way to gain experience before applying for an external placement.

Once they have demonstrated the skills and confidence needed for an external placement we will seek to find the appropriate role for them outside of school and currently I'm happy to report we have students working at the hospital, a nursery, a hotel, an equestrian centre, a café and a drop in social centre for the other 50s.













Post-16 - A Message from Sally, Head of Centre

Over at the Leicester Royal Infirmary Renu and Margaret continue to run a fantastic program for Project Search. We have three students who have now been offered contracts at Leicester Hospitals and another deemed work ready. In order to maximise their chances of employability in an organisation that befits their interests and skills three students are now pursuing placements in organisations outside of the hospital. They continue to be mentored by Renu and Margaret and it's exciting to see their experiences in retail and hospitality extend through the partnership with two more large organisations (Tesco and Primark).

Leicester University Hospitals continue to be huge ambassadors of the Project Search program and our students have been included in the hospital newsletter which is shared with their 17,000 staff.

They've also recently paid for professional photos of our students to use in a campaign to celebrate their success and our future relationship with them.





So in summary this term has been about community, partnerships and preparation for employment. Through those activities I hope you can see how our students have been living out the school motto of 'Be Your Best, Be Happy and Believe!'.


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
